# VOIT A STRONG MUNICH WITHIN A STRONG EUROPE

Europe starts locally - in cities, municipalities and neighbourhoods. These are the places where we decide how to tackle the big challenges of our time. Especially the climate crisis, the increasing social inequalities, threats to our democracy through authoritarian movements, how to handle global migration, the demographic change and the digital and economic transformation. As a pan-European party we are convinced that these challenges need to be solved internationally, on the European level. They need a new way of thinking in politics: connected, forward-facing and across borders. That is why we founded Volt. A political movement which is active in 32 countries within Europe, to find practical solutions for our continent. Starting locally, in municipalities and cities.

For Munich we envision a city that belongs to everyone. A city that is economically strong, socially just, ecologically responsible and digitally ready for the future. Our policies are neither idealistic nor technocratic, it is oriented towards a bright future, pragmatic and based on facts. We want to ask what is helpful? And what will truly bring Munich forward?

Volt stands for progressive politics: based on solutions, including the European view and being responsible. We want to achieve a city in which innovation and community can go hand in hand through which it will become the most liveable city in Europe. For a Munich, where traditions and changes are a powerful alliance to design our future together. A city which will be a role model for all of Europe.

A city, where living is no longer a luxury but a basic human right for all. A city, where rent stays affordable because we build housing fast, sustainably and socially just. The entire city will be a big park-like space with colorful and mixed neighbourhoods, that make room for lively quarters and give space to everyone. Supermarkets, playgrounds, schools, kindergartens, doctors, pharmacies, restaurants, cafés and bars but also all other community spaces are reachable within 15 minutes for everyone, embedded within nature and recreational spaces which aid our health and make Munich more liveable. Singleuse cups and plates will no longer be used, instead there will be a comprehensive and uniform multi-use system for To-Go products a big circular system within the whole city. All buildings will carry solar cells and together with geothermal energy will stabilise energy prices for everyone, which will be unaffected by the global energy market. District cooling replaces loud and inefficient air conditioning systems and cools the city on hot days - with significantly easier technology in buildings.

A city which simplifies our life. In which we can manage everything in the Munich App. From appointments with the administration offices and tickets for the public transport to citizen participation for projects.

A city, where mobility is fun. With a holistic cycling system and pedestrian zones, which are hugged by trees and accompanied by drinking fountains. With fresh and clean air because the car traffic is electric only – with more and more —

→ self driving taxis. And with an efficient and accessible public transport, that invites people to change their way of travel.

A Munich, that bravely looks towards the future. With innovation-centres that encourage new ideas and attract investors to create jobs sustainably. In which necessary workers from abroad can get working visas easy and fast to start working in local businesses. And with a true and lived democracy, in which residents can decide themselves how to improve their neighbourhood. A city, which leaves no one

behind because child care is accessible to all families, the city administration is inclusive and accessible, and where the social communities are celebrated.

With big developments like in 'Neu-Freiham' and the 'Münchner Norden' we have unique chances to embed these concepts holistically and from the beginning. These projects will be flagship projects for Munich and inspirations for all of Europe.

All this is not a dream. It is our plan – a plan which we base on our six Guiding Principles and six Focus Areas:

# KEY FOCUS AREAS OF OUR MUNICH POLICIES

What should Munich look like in ten, twenty or fifty years? This question guides our political work. In this programme, we show how we will tackle the city's major challenges – from housing to mobility, education, the economy and culture.

It is not just about visions, but about feasible solutions. We identify the challenges, define clear goals and propose concrete measures that will make our city more equitable, more sustainable and more European. From the outset, we also consider how our proposals can be funded and make specific recommendations.



## **Housing & Urban Development**

"Affordable, sustainable, liveable –

#### this is how we build the Munich of tomorrow."



Volt advocates for affordable housing and liveable, climate-resilient neighbourhoods because housing is a social right. Our urban development approach combines social justice with sustainability and climate protection – for a Munich that remains liveable for everyone in the future.

#### Our measures include:

#### ★ More Housing – Building Faster, Smart Densification, Steering Equitably

Page 20

Volt accelerates construction of housing by using faster and digital planning processes as well as cost-saving models such as the "Hamburg Standard." Through consistent social land-use policies (SoBoN) with up to 60% social housing, stronger support for housing cooperatives and well-planned densification, we create urgently needed affordable homes. This ensures social cohesion across all districts.

#### ★ Secure Fair Rent Page 22

Volt protects tenants effectively against displacement. Municipal land will only be leased under long-term hereditary building rights to developers who guarantee permanently affordable rent. With strict enforcement against misuse of housing and a new mediation office for rental conflicts, we create more transparency and fairness in Munich's tense housing market.

#### ★ Circular Construction – Saving Resources, Protecting the Climate, Shaping the Future Page 23

Volt establishes the circular economy as a new standard in Munich's construction sector. Binding requirements for reusable materials, digital material passports and support for pilot projects reduce waste and CO₂ emissions. A municipal depot for reusable materials will make Munich a pioneer for sustainable and resource-efficient construction.

#### ★ Climate-Resilient Living – Today and Tomorrow

Page 24

Volt prepares Munich for the climate crisis. A major programme to unseal surfaces and building urban greenery on roofs, façades and public squares creates a "natural air conditioning system" for the city. More drinking fountains, shaded "cooling oases" and small green spaces protect public health and increase quality of life, especially on hot days.

#### ★ Clean Energy, Stable Prices – For a Fair and Sustainable Energy System

Page 25

Volt strengthens the Stadtwerke München (SWM) as a public provider of renewable energy to ensure long-term price stability and independence from global energy markets. Profits are reinvested directly into local renewable energy expansion and social tariffs so that the energy transition benefits everyone.



## **Mobility**

#### "A city for people, not for traffic jams –

#### climate-friendly and safe en route."



Volt is building a modern, safe and climate-friendly mobility system that prioritizes public transport, cycling and walking – for fewer traffic jams, cleaner air and a city designed for people. We draw on the best practices from Europe.

#### Our measures include:

#### ★ An Accessible, High-Performance Public Transport System

Page 27

Volt is expanding Munich's public transport (bus, tram, U-Bahn and S-Bahn) into a powerful and inclusive alternative to private cars for the future. Through improved frequency and quality and with expanded U-Bahn and tram lines and new express bus routes, we strengthen connectivity across the entire city. All public transport will become fully accessible, so everyone can participate in the cities mobility.

#### ★ Quiet and Clean: E-Mobility, Autonomous Vehicles and a Car-Free Old Town

Page 28

Munich should become quieter, cleaner and more liveable: through a gradual transition to a car-reduced historic city centre, more space for pedestrians and cyclists and attractive public spaces. We promote car-sharing, e-mobility and smart traffic management while creating conditions for autonomous vehicles to operate in Munich. Future autonomous car-sharing and other alternatives to private cars will reduce traffic, improve air quality and transform the city centre into a vibrant space for community life.

#### ★ Safe on the Move – Munich as a Cycling City

Page 29

Volt turns Munich into a genuine cycling city by fully implementing the city's cycling referendum. We create a continuous, safe network of cycling routes with wide, physically separated lanes and safe intersections, inspired by leading European cities. More secure bike parking and green corridors along cycling routes make cycling the most attractive and safest mode of transport for people of all ages.

#### ★ Walking Through Munich – Safe, Green and Accessible

Page 30

We strengthen pedestrian mobility with wider, safer, pavements that are without physical barriers and are kept free from parked cars. More greenery, seating and better lighting create inviting neighbourhood spaces with high quality of stay. In close cooperation with local residents, we redesign public spaces so that everyone feels welcome and safe when walking through their neighbourhood.

#### ★ A City of Short Distances

Page 31

Volt develops Munich into a city of short distances, where all essential daily services are reachable within 15 minutes by foot or bike. New neighbourhoods are planned according to this principle from the outset, while existing ones are improved through targeted densification. This strengthens quality of life, local communities and reduces unnecessary traffic.



## Work & Economy

"Munich: Europe's No. 1 Economic Hub –

#### sustainable and ready for the future."



Volt strengthens Munich's role as a European centre of innovation by closely linking science, business and urban development. Our goal: creating new jobs which are fair, climate-friendly and future-oriented that combine prosperity, sustainability and social cohesion.

#### Our measures include:

#### \* Attracting Skilled Workers, Cutting Red Tape – with a Digital Administration

Page 33

We make Munich more attractive to international skilled workers by removing bureaucratic barriers. With more staff in the immigration office, a digital "fast lane" for qualified workers and designated contact personnel for companies, we significantly accelerate administrative procedures. A modern, service-oriented administration becomes a decisive competitive advantage in the race for the best talent.

#### ★ Munich's Continuing Education Network – Digitally Equipped for the Future

Page 34

Volt addresses the shortage of skilled workers through a digital and central network for professional development and education. This platform connects all relevant providers and makes their programs easy to find and accessible for residents. A special focus is on expanding the courses for digital skills, ensuring that Munich's people are prepared for the world of tomorrow.

#### ★ Munich as a Hub for Business & Innovation

Page 35

Volt strengthens the link between cutting-edge research and entrepreneurship to secure Munich's innovative power. The municipal start-up office will be expanded and will connect start-ups with established companies, acting as "business angels." We create sufficient affordable commercial space for crafts, retail and industry. By introducing regulatory sandboxes, we establish protected testing environments where new technologies can be trialled safely and developed to market readiness.

#### Creating Value Together – New Procurement Models

Page 36

Volt introduces new procurement and contracting models to deliver large municipal projects faster, more sustainably and more cost-effectively – from energy-efficient housing to multi-use mobility hubs and smart-city infrastructure. Public and private partners combine financing, expertise and innovation to create true added value for the city and its residents. At the same time, we ensure that local small and medium-sized businesses are fairly included.

#### ★ Open Data for Innovation, Transparency and New Business Models

Page 37

Volt transforms Munich into a genuine open-data city. We expand the municipal data portal and make high-quality, machine-readable data from administration, mobility and urban planning publicly available. This fosters transparency and enables companies, start-ups and researchers to develop innovative services and new business models for the public.



## **Culture & Community Life**

#### "Fostering diversity and creating spaces –

for a vibrant city."



Volt strengthens cultural diversity, secures public spaces and makes culture, nightlife and community offerings accessible to everyone as the foundation of a vibrant, inspiring and inclusive Munich. A diverse city needs places for encounters, expression and participation.

#### Our measures include:

#### ★ Culture for All – Diverse, Accessible, Community-Based

Page 39

Volt brings culture directly into the neighbourhoods and into everyday life. By supporting street festivals, pop-up culture and the independent culture scene through low-bureaucracy funding, we create lively communities. Public spaces such as the Olympiapark become year-round community culture venues. Through a cultural sponsorship model and more performance spaces, we strengthen civic engagement and the diversity of Munich's cultural scene.

#### ★ Spaces for Diversity – Queer Life and Subculture

Page 40

Volt advocates for a city where queer life and subculture are visible, safe and well supported. With targeted cultural funding, the creation of safe spaces and the structural anchoring of queer perspectives in administration and education, we reduce discrimination. Visibility of queer history in the urban landscape and gender-sensitive language in all municipal departments strengthens diversity and makes Munich a truly welcoming city.

#### ★ Safety Instead of Stigma – Modernising the Approach to Substance Use

Page 41

Volt focuses on prevention, decriminalisation and dignified access to support services rather than taboos and repression. Through early education, safe consumption and counselling spaces, strengthened school social work and targeted information campaigns, we minimize risks, increase resilience and improve public safety.

#### ★ A Digital City in Everyday Life – with the München App as the Key

Page 42

We develop the München App into the central digital access point for city life. All municipal services – from administration to culture and mobility – are bundled there in an easy, safe and low-barrier way. Residents can book appointments, buy tickets and submit applications. This strengthens not only administrative efficiency but also transparency and digital participation for everyone.

#### ★ Protecting Nightlife – Introducing Temporary 'Culture Zones'

Page 43

Volt protects and supports Munich's nightlife as an essential part of urban culture. By creating temporarily designated "culture zones" in selected streets, we provide reliable free spaces for gastronomy and events. A designated night mayor acts as a central mediator between nightlife venues, residents and the administration, proactively resolving conflicts.

#### ★ Less Waste, More Reuse – Munich Ends Single-Use Packaging

Page 44

We eliminate single-use packaging for ready-to-eat products in the city by 2027. Through a central tender for a mandatory city-wide reusable pool system, we create an easy and affordable standard for all businesses. This reduces millions of disposable items each year, cuts cleaning costs and makes Munich a pioneer for sustainable consumption.



#### **Education & Childcare**

"Good education needs strong structures –

#### to establish true opportunities from the start."



We invest in early childhood care, modern schools and targeted support because education is the key to participation from day one. With an intelligent, equitable and future-oriented education landscape, we lay the foundation for a strong and cohesive Munich.

#### Our measures include:

#### ★ Expanding Crèche, Kindergarten and All-Day School Places

Page 46

Volt wants every child in Munich to have equal opportunities from the very beginning. We create the necessary places, ensure a diversity of providers and improve conditions for all childcare institutions. A reformed financing model provides planning certainty and reduces bureaucracy. We strengthen inclusive, reliable lunch and holiday programmes and invest in better working conditions, fair pay and more professional workers.

#### ★ Modern School Buildings and Sports Facilities

Page 48

Volt wants schools that enable modern teaching and all-day learning and are well-ventilated, digitally equipped, flexibly usable and designed together with the school community. From 2026 onwards, every school receives its own per-student budget to decide independently on necessary investments. We also build modern sports facilities that are open to sport clubs and residents after school hours – creating places of learning and activity that promote knowledge, confidence and joy.

#### ★ Supporting Educational Staff

Page 49

Volt strengthens educational staff through targeted relief and professional support. We introduce external school social work at pilot schools, offer certified training on topics like inclusion and diversity, and establish supervision offers and psychological counselling. Administrative support staff reduce bureaucratic workload, so educators can refocus on their core work.

#### ★ Strengthening Participation and Democracy in Everyday School Life

Page 50

Volt promotes a culture of lived democracy in Munich's schools – with strong student parliaments, open parent cafés and low-threshold participation formats. Schools should offer real influence for all students and parents. City-wide programmes such as "Schule der Vielfalt" and "Demokratie leben!" are expanded and interconnected so that democratic values become tangible in everyday school life.

#### ★ Integration Through Education From Day One

Page 51

Volt ensures that all children have fair educational opportunities from their first day in Munich. A city-wide multilingual "education guide" programme accompanies newly arrived families from childcare to vocational training. Schools receive additional resources for integration and welcome classes, and we support multi-professional teams to enable collective successful learning.



## **Lived Democracy**

"Democracy emerges where there is

#### space for participation and diversity."



Politics is, at its core, the collective shaping of our shared life. Volt wants to involve residents even more closely in this process, especially at the local level. People know best what is needed in their neighbourhoods. We strengthen civic participation, political education and diversity in society – for a strong, functioning and vibrant democracy.

#### Our measures include:

#### ★ Let's Talk – Expanding and Institutionalising Citizens' Assemblies

Page 53

Volt strengthens democracy by establishing randomly selected citizens' assemblies at both city and district levels. These bodies develop specific recommendations on key policy issues and ensure that Munich's social diversity is represented in political decision-making. This makes participation accessible and impactful for all residents.

#### ★ Trust Instead of Frustration – Co-Shaping Instead of Complaining

Page 54

Volt creates new formats for political accessibility in order to rebuild trust in public institutions. Through regular neighbourhood dialogues, digital feedback platforms and dedicated ombudspeople, politics becomes more transparent and responsive. District committees are given more authority and budget so they can make decisions directly on site.

#### ★ Young Ideas – Giving the Youth a Real Voice

Page 55

Volt gives young people a meaningful voice in local politics. We introduce youth budgets in schools so young people can implement their own projects. An institutionalized youth council with direct ties to the city council ensures that youth perspectives are systematically considered in all decisions that affect them – from mobility to leisure.
